WICHITA, KS. – **Thomas A. Scott**, MD, clinical assistant professor, Internal Medicine, will present: “Asthma: Causes, types, and treatments,” from 11:30-1 p.m., Tuesday, April 8, in the Sunflower Room, during the Live and Learn Lecture, at the University of Kansas School of Medicine-Wichita, 1010 N. Kansas. The lecture is free and open to the public, but reservations are requested by calling University Relations at (316) 293-2643.

Dr. Scott received his MD from Meharry Medical College and completed his Internal Medicine internship and residency at Western Reserve Care System in Youngstown, Ohio. He is a diplomate of the National Board of Medical Examiners, the American Board of Internal Medicine, and Immunology; and a member of the coordinating committee for the National Conference on the Black Family. In 2005 and 2007, he was named one of Wichita’s top 150 doctors by “The Wichita Register.”

The University of Kansas School of Medicine-Wichita is nationally recognized as a pioneer in community-oriented medical education. Since the first class graduated in 1975, 1,504 physicians have earned medical degrees. About half of these eventually established practices in the state, fulfilling KUSM-W’s promise of “Educating Doctors For Kansas.”
